Tiny Treks - Dunham Massey (Deer and Trees)


Start: Dunham Massey National Trust, Charcoal Rd, Altrincham, Cheshire WA14 4SJ Facilities/ Information: Toilets, Parking (£5 non N/Trust members), Information, Café and shop.

Walk: 2 miles (2hrs), Easy.

Walk instructions.

- 1. From the Car park follow the sign to Dunham Hall. Passing the Moat (left) and old tree (Q1) continue past the Clock Tower (Q2) towards the Mill (Q3).
- 2. Continuing on that path veer to the right on a path that takes you down an avenue away from the hall (Q4).
- 3. Immediately looking right there is a long grassed avenue (Q5) leading to an Obelisk (Q6).
- 4. At the Obelisk turn left following the low fenced boundary of the Deer Sanctuary (Q7)
- 5. Reaching a more substantial path turn **right** until you reach a brick wall **(Q8)** and gate where you turn **left** through some **tall gates (Q8)**.
- 6. Pass through two tall gates, and turn left onto another grassed avenue.
- 7. Follow this until you see the low fence of the Deer sanctuary skirting a path on the right. Turn right just before the Slaughter House (Q9).
- 8. Having looked at the Slaughter House return and continue along this path until you reach the main tarmac Charcoal Drive. Across this you will see the Deer Barn (Q10).
- 9. Returning to Charcoal Drive walk towards the Main Dunham Hall. Looking on the right for the wood carved statues (Q11)
- 10. Reaching Dunham Hall walk down the main drive to the front door (Q12). Reaching the front door turn left pass under the clock tower and return to the car park.
